Introduction

San Marcos Children's Park located on 205 South C M Allen Parkway, San Marcos, TX. The playground area it is made out of wood, there is so much to climb such as bridges, castles, houses, spaceships, rings, swings, etc. Because of it's wooden construction, the park has a lot of visibility, which makes easier for parents to keep track of their kids. This park has picnic tables around the park and playground.

According to Kids Play Park website this park is one of the largest of its kind in the U.S. It was proposed for local mothers and constructed in 1992 in six days by a total of 4377 adults, and 1398 children from dawn to dusk. Every year the second Saturday of November all the people are invited to maintain the Park.

Research

Direct Observations

While I was doing the research for this park, the first thing I noticed is that kids normally are by themselves in the playground. Parents normally stay on the picnic tables and benches close to the area, but they are not totally watching or taking care of them.

When I left the park I went to the library right away, to be there almost at the same time of the day and make comparisons between these two places. For my surprise when I got to the library it was empty, there was just one family in there and that was it, no kids; even when San Marcos Public Library counts with a great area for kids.

When I compared this two places I made the assumption that in certain way the responsible of this behavior are the parents. Kids do not decide where to go or what to do.

Interviews/Surveys

When I was looking for information in order to know kids better, I interviewed an elementary school teacher and several parents that were in the park. I did simple questions to parents who had kids of the age range I needed.

Fernanda de los Santos, teacher in County Line Elementary in New Braunfels, said that kids does not like to read, but there are always exceptions. Kids prefer to interact with games with color, and interactive board.

At the park the ladys I interviewed told me that they always are looking for new ways for the kids to learn in an interactive way, they really like to play with ipads and colors do have influence on the learning process. Girls are faster than boys in the learning process.

Objectives

The objective is to create a fun-learning enviroment with interactive games, for parents and kids in order to accelerate kids learning process and increase parents involvement on their kids reading development.

The park it is a place mostly identified for fun; the response of "Let's go to the park" is totally different than "Let's go to the library". Texas has a high number of hispanic population which means that a lot of our kids are bilingual nowaday; these boards will have certain words in english and spanish to increase the spanish understanding for non-hispanic people.

The physical space of these instalations will be located at San Marcos Children's Park, it has a lot of space in the play area and where the picnic tables are located, far from the bigger kids.

Design Proposal

Chalkboards will be installed all over the park where the grown-ups and kids are . On one side there will be an outlined letterforms for smaller kids to color the inside, and on the other side will be the letter with a dotted space in order for them to fill in a word that begins with. Two kids will be able to use the chalkboard at the same time because of its horizontal position.

The typeface used for this project is Museo Sans, the rounded typeface it is more attractive to kids. It is also geometrical, the counters are really rounded, straigth lines, and basic forms, in order for them to learn the letterform easier. W


